

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
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Q-250 SOLO ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Tools needed: Two 7/16" and two 1/2 "wrench and one 5/32" hex key wrench. Ratchet or battery powered impact wrench with sockets will speed the process.

If possible, we suggest Step 1 thru 9 be performed at home or camp before taking to the field to avoid possibility of losing parts.

Platform Assembly (Expanded metal removed for clarity)

Step 1. Bolt the 2 parts of the platform together using four $\frac{1}{2}$ x 2-3/4" bolts, eight washers and four nuts. Place washers under the head of bolt and nuts as seen in Figure 1.



Step 2. Install the two middle platform braces using eight ¼" x 2-3/4" bolts, sixteen washers and eight nuts. Place washers under the head of bolts and under the nuts. Note: Loosely tighten the nuts at this time. **If installing the optional M-369 seat this is the time to install the hub per instructions on page 18.**



Step 3. Attach the ladder mount and front platform braces using eight $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 2-3/4" bolts, sixteen washers and eight nuts.

Make sure the ladder mount is on the opposite end of platform from the leg mounts.

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Note: Tighten all the nuts on the complete platform assembly now. Do not over tighten as it can collapse the tubing.



Step 4. Attach the hand rail supports to the rear (ladder side) of the platform using four $\frac{1}{3}$ x 1-3/4" bolts and two $\frac{1}{3}$ " x 3-7/8" bolts, twelve washers and 6 nuts as seen in Figure 4. You can tighten all the nuts.

Leg Assembly



Step 5. Two leg assemblies are adjustable. Use one leg connectors two 5/16" x 2" bolts, 4 washers and two nuts on each leg. Place washers under the head of bolts and under the nuts. Loosely tighten nuts then go back and tighten them.

Attach the adjustable foot with 5/16" x 2 "bolt, two washers and one nut. Place washers under the head of the bolt and under the nuts. Be sure to use the top hole in the adjustable foot as seen in Figure 5.



Step 6. Assemble the six cross braces by sliding the 7/8" tube inside the 1" tube and secure with one 1/4" x 1-3/4" bolt two washers and a nut as seen in Figure 6. Now try to pull the two pieces apart to ensure that the bolt went thru the hole. Tighten the bolts at this time.

Ladder Assembly





Step 7. Assemble the three ladder sections together using four ladder connector, eight 5/16" x 2"-1/2" bolts, sixteen flat washers and eight nuts, placing washers under the head of bolt and under the nuts as seen in Figure 7. Snug all nuts then go back and tighten.




Step 8. Assemble the four pieces of the roof main frame using two frame connecter tubes four 1/4 x 1-3/4" socket head screws, four nuts. No washers under the head of screws or the nut. Tighten all nuts.



Step 9. Assemble the eight roof ribs to the roof cap using eight $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1-3/4" socket head bolts, and eight washers and eight nuts. Place washers under the nuts, none under the head of bolts **NOT**E: **Just snug the nuts at this time.**

Do not attach the roof ribs to the roof main frame at this time, they will be bolted later when you install the uprights




Step 10. Place the platform flat on the ground with the bottom facing up.

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Bolt the legs to the mounts on the platform using two 5/16" x 2-1/2" bolts, four washers and two nuts. Place washers under the head of the bolt and under the nuts. Bolt the ladder to the platform using two 5/16" x 2" bolts, four washers and two nuts placing washers under the head of the bolts and under the nuts You can tighten the nuts.

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

Step 11. Installing the cross braces will require the help of 2 other people to prevent damaging the stand. Have two people lift and hold the legs and install one cross brace between the two legs and ladder placing them on the inside of the brackets using six 1/4" x 1-3/4" bolts, 12 washers and 6 nuts. Place washers under the head of bolts and under the nuts as seen in Figure 11. Finger tighten the nuts at this time. Do not release the legs or ladder until all 3 braces are attached.

STEP 12. Install the remaining three braces in the same manor except place them on the outside of the bracket, this will prevent the braces from touching where they cross. You can now tighten all the bolts.



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It is helpful to place a block between the platform and the ground about 10" tall.

Step 13. Place the stand on its front. As seen in Figure 13-A. You can now install the hand rails. Install the hand rails on to the hand rail supports using four 5/16" x 2-7/8" bolts, eight washers and four nuts. Place a washer under the head of the bolt and one under the nut as seen in Figure 13-B. Tighten nuts.




Step 14. Turn the roof assembly upside down and install the long uprights onto the roof assembly using eight $\frac{1}{4}$ x 1-3/4" socket head bolts, eight U shaped backer plates and eight nuts as seen in Figure 14-A. Make sure versa buttons are facing the inside of the blind as seen in Figure 14-B

No washer under head of bolts or nuts as seen in Figure 14-A. Tighten all the nuts on the

complete assembly.

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



Step 15. Open the cam lever while inserting on the upright as seen in Figure 15-A. Failure to do so can damage the cam locks. Place 4 shooting rails on the long uprights in the order shown in Figure 15-B. Then install the other four shooting rails in the remaining spaces. Slide all the shooting rails about half way down the uprights and lock into position.



Step 16. Install all the short uprights to the platform using eight ¼" x 1-3/4" socket head bolts, eight u shaped backer plates and nuts, **no washers under the head of bolt or nuts. Make sure the black versa buttons are facing the inside of the blind as seen in Figure 16. Tighten all bolts on the platform assembly.**

NOTE: If you are installing the M-369 seats in your Buck hut now is the best time to install the hub per the M-369 instructions.

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

Step 17. With the help of at least two people place the roof section on by sliding the uprights together. It is best to insert the top two about 1 inch then start lining them up all the way to the bottom and slide the assembly on all at once.



Step 18. You must have at least 4 people to lift the stand. Lift from the platform not the roof or uprights. Have one person stand on the foot of one of the legs to prevent the stand from sliding.



Step 19. Install the blind cover. The cover can be installed standing inside of the blind. Locate the zipper, while one person holds the zipper in the approximate location on the roof main frame as seen in Figure 19 the other person wraps the fabric around the blind making 16. 2182020

sure they are pulling it very tight and it is flush with the roof main frame and the snap buckles are in the correct location in line with the roof ribs, they can also connect 3 of the bungees on top as they go to help hold the fabric up. Make sure all the bungee are hanging outside the blind and not between the fabric and the main frame. Do not connect all the bungee at this time. As one person pulls the fabric tight the other starts the zipper. It is best if one person pulls the fabric together ahead of the zipper during the zipping process.






Figure 20 A Top Bungee.

Step 20. Once the zipper is completely closed and the fabric is even with the top of the roof main frame and the buckles line up with the uprights and the roof ribs you can begin connecting all the bungee as seen in Figure 20- A and 20- B Connect one bottom bungee then the corresponding top bungee until they are all connected.

Note: There are eight bungee on the bottom and eight on the top that connect to the versa buttons on the uprights.

Step 21 You can now install the roof. The roof cover is equipped with eight buckles to connect to the buckles that are on the side of the blind. Place the fabric on the roof and pull it down all the way around and connect the buckles by reaching thru the windows and pull snug, do not over tighten as it will pull the side fabric up at the bottom. Try to get all sides even. After you finish go outside and walk around the blind and check it and adjust if necessary.




Step 22. Your Solo Buck Hut comes with four anchor stakes one for each leg, and two for the ladder, they must be hammered all the way into the ground at approximately a 45 degree angle as in Figure 21.

OPTIONAL M-369 ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

For use on M-360, T-360, L-366, Q-200 and Q-250 only.





Step 1. Assemble the seat by placing the Upper Seat Support to the Seat Upright by using one $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1-7/8" bolt, two washers and one nut as seen in Figure A. Now Assemble the seat frame to the upright with two $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1-3/8" bolts, four washers and two nuts. Place washers under the head of the bolts. Insert bolts thru Seat Mount Bracket then thru seat assembly and place washers under the nuts. Be sure seat locator pin is in the hole in the upright. This assures the proper position of the seat as seen in Figure B.



Step 2. Assemble the hub to the platform as seen in Figure 1.

Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death!



WARNING! NEVER hunt out of a shooting house at heights at which you are not completely comfortable. Depending on the hunting conditions, choose the minimum hunting height that allows for safe, effective hunting. Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death!



WARNING! Strict weight limitations have been set for each product(s) to ensure your personal safety. STEP 1: With the help of three (3) other adults (four (4) total), gently lift the standing platform of the shooting house and walk it up until erect.

STEP 2. Check to make sure the platform is on secure and level ground and the standing and seating platforms are level. If the platform is unlevel, adjust the two (2) adjustable bottom legs until the platform is level (as directed in these instructions). NOTE: Holes are provided in the feet to allow for staking (i.e., anchoring) to the ground for additional safety. Extreme precaution shall be used to ensure that the stand is stable prior to climbing. You must use the four (4) stakes provided to anchor the legs. These stakes provide a firm foundation for the shooting house when installed on level ground as detailed in these Instructions.



WARNING! You must secure your shooting house to preclude it from tipping or shifting during installation and/or use. Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death!



PLEASE READ THIS MANUAL IN ITS ENTIRETY PRIOR TO USING THIS PRODUCT!

WARNING! Never attempt to level a platform by inserting, or using scrap lumber, rocks, tree limbs or branches, cardboard, or any other material(s). Your Millennium Buck Hut Shooting House is equipped with an adjustable shooting rail. This adjustable shooting rail MUST BE kept ABOVE the top of the entry/exit door AT ALL TIMES when entering and exiting the shooting house. NEVER attempt to step over it or use it as a hand-hold/handle/grab when entering or exiting the shooting house. USE only the handrails PROVIDED.



WARNING! Caution MUST BE EXERCISED when entering or exiting the shooting house as you are stepping over the shooting house fabric covering. Attention must be paid not to trip over this shooting house fabric. Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death!

Your Millennium Buck Hut Shooting House fabric cover is made of a fire retardant material. It is, however, NOT FIRE PROOF. Extreme caution must be paid to keep any heat producing devices (e.g., space heaters, hand warmers, etc.) away from the fabric covering.



WARNING! NEVER ATTEMPT to use this Millennium Buck Hut Shooting House when winds exceed 20 miles per hour. Abnormally high, gusty winds increase the risk of the shooting house toppling over. Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death!

REMOVING BUCK HUT SHOOTING HOUSE



WARNING! When climbing, always maintain three points of contact as you ascend (climb up) and while descending (climb down). Failure to maintain three points of contact puts the user at serious risk of bodily injury. Failure to follow these instructions will result in serious injury or death!

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WARNING! You must have four (4) adults to install or remove your shooting house. Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death!

STEP 1. With the help of three (3) other adults (four (4) total), remove the stakes from the legs and slowly tip the shooting house and walk it down to the ground.

Your new Millennium shooting house is factory finished with a state-of- the-art powder coating that guarantees years of trouble-free service. It is recommended that you store your shooting house out of direct sunlight and out of any other harsh environmental condition(s) that may adversely affect its performance.
